The Secretariat of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) is pleased to inform the non-governmental organizations receiving the present communication that the IAEA will hold the International Symposium on Standards, Applications and Quality Assurance in Medical Radiation Dosimetry (IDOS 2026) (hereinafter referred to as "event") to be held at the IAEA's Headquarters in Vienna, Austria, from 5 to 9 October 2026.

The purpose of the event is to provide an international forum to discuss and disseminate the latest advances across radiation dosimetry, radiation medicine, radiation protection and associated standards. In covering all of the medical specialities that utilize ionizing radiation, the symposium will specifically focus on the fields in which dosimetry standardization is essential: radiotherapy, radiology, radiopharmaceutical therapy and nuclear medicine. Moreover, the symposium will address cross-cutting topics such as artificial intelligence-based methods, uncertainty of measurements, and dosimetric audits; outline future trends; and identify areas for improvement. Its proceedings and conclusions will help to provide relevant recommendations for the medical and scientific community.

The event will be held in English.

The organizations receiving the present communication are invited to disseminate the attached Announcement and Call for Papers to the target audience for the event and to designate participants using the InTouch+ platform, as indicated in Section H. Submissions of papers using InTouch+ can only be considered if received by the deadline indicated in Section O of the Announcement and Call for Papers. Organizations are strongly encouraged to designate women participants.

It should be noted that compensation is not payable by the IAEA for any damage to or loss of personal property. The IAEA also does not provide health insurance coverage for participants in events. Arrangements for private insurance coverage on an individual basis should therefore be made. The IAEA will, however, provide insurance coverage for accidents and illnesses that clearly result from any work performed for the IAEA.
